Therefore, we need media to help students in practicing their speaking skills. Media can also make teaching and learning activities more creative, innovative and interesting. And now the use of technology has become a natural thing for the younger generation so that a teacher is also required to be able to innovate. (Gagne and Briggs, 1975) say that learning media includes the tools used for teaching materials. In other words, learning media is a tool used to convey the content of the subject matter. #### **DISCUSSION**



In this discussion, we will provide some suggestions of media that can be used by teachers and students in carrying out the learning process during a pandemic. Some of these media have been proven by many researchers who are believed to be able to provide an interesting and effective learning atmosphere. Platforms that can be used include Vlogs, WhatsApp, Storyline Articulations, and Hand Puppets. With this media, it is hoped that teachers and students can apply it well and make the learning process more effective and efficient.

## 1. Vlog (Video Blog)

Vlog is a video blogging that contains video, images, sound, and text. This vlog is made in the form of a video or entered into an event to be uploaded to a platform called YouTube. Baran (2007) vlogs have become a new way of communicating through media that is currently popular. (Harmer, 2001) states that videos can stimulate students' stimulation, they can provide feedback by evaluating and making students' thoughts realistic. In other words, videos can make the learning process short and simple. Several studies have tested the effectiveness of vlogs uploaded by the YouTube platform in learning English skills. Most of the results issued stated that vlogs can make it easier for students to speak. YouTube is a video sharing platform where people will make videos and be included as users, which can be used as a medium to communicate and socialize with other users, and they can vote and comment and allow followers to enter into users' lives (Burgess & Green, (2009); Chan & Lewis, (2011); Steve & Lawson, (2013)). This vlog can also increase their confidence when they practice speaking in English. And the vlog also makes it easier for teachers to assess them in English. These vlogs have been considered as effective tools in enhancing the learning experience. It is highly recommended for staff for tourist attractions to learn how to teach YouTube into the teaching and learning process (Moghavvemi et al, 2019).

So, the use of vlogs in the English learning process is very good. Using video blogs to teach speaking can improve students' speaking skills in terms of acceptable pronunciation, correct grammar, and proper vocabulary. Teachers should be able to take this approach as an alternative in overcoming barriers to learning English speaking skills during the COVID-19 situation. Teachers must also design assessment techniques that are comprehensive and authentic to determine whether students have achieved the ability to master the material or not. This has been based on a study (Ersan et al, 2022) that students have very high enthusiasm and feel happy when learning takes place and motivate students to communicate in English.

## 2. WhatsApp

Mobile-assisted language learning (MALL) has become popular among English language teaching and learning circles around the world. The incorporation of various technologies has increased the progress of students in the process of learning aspects that contain the context of vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation, listening, and speaking (Hwang et al, 2011; Hwang & Tsai, 2011; Hwang et al, 2013). There have been many mobile studies developed in the progress of students to be applied to learning such as Snapchat, BBM, Line, Kiki, Twitter, Instagram, and WhatsApp.

WhatsApp is an application that can be used to send messages (chat) / voice



messages, pictures, videos, and calls. The WhatsApp application is a software used for communication sources where most of the users are students (Khan et al, 2021). The use of WhatsApp in the application of learning English has been investigated to determine its effectiveness in understanding vocabulary and other language skills (Al-Emran et al, 2016; Dashti & Aldashti, 2015; Kiili et al, 2010; Njoku, 2016). Most of us certainly as educators can understand their students in the limited pronunciation of students in English. With a lack of vocabulary, students will find it difficult to explain and express ideas orally.

Therefore, teachers can use MALL in the form of a WhatsApp application as a learning and communication suggestion to add new vocabulary through pictures and illustrations, this is done to produce sentences in discussions. Based on the results of research (Sherine et al, 2020) efforts to create an interaction space in the target language through the WhatsApp social media application can have a positive impact on students. This WhatsApp application is able to communicate anywhere and anytime and can be used individually or in groups.

## 3. Storyline Articulation

During the COVID-19 pandemic, it had a huge impact on the world of education. Learning activities are carried out virtually and via the internet remotely. In order for the learning process to run smoothly and effectively, teachers as facilitators are required to be able to create innovative media so that students can be enthusiastic about teaching and learning activities (Saputro & Lumbantoruan, 2020). The lecture method and giving assignments were one of the problems found by the researchers. It is important now that teachers must create new media so that students are not bored and bored in distance learning. Updates need to be implemented to overcome this, indirectly improving students' speaking skills. The solution to this problem is to use storyline articulation-based learning media.

Articulate Storyline is a piece of software that can be used to create presentations. Having the same function as Microsoft Power Point, Articulate Storyline has several advantages so that it can produce more comprehensive and creative presentations. This software also has features such as timeline, movie, picture, character and others that are easy to use. Based on (Kartiani & Anam, 2019; Setyaningsih, 2017; Sindu et al., 2020) storyline articulation media is proven to improve students' cognitive abilities and skills in speaking English. Several studies have proven that storyline-based articulation learning media is very effective in learning. Storyline-based media can be used in terms of media validation and fourth grade students' responses to biodiversity and plant learning, effective in integrated thematic learning to increase learning motivation, can increase elementary school students' interest in learning science, valid in increasing learning independence in text material negotiation and storyline articulation have a positive effect on learning recitation with the easy method (Nugroho & Arrosyad, 2020; Sinta et al., 2021; Hadza et al., 2020; Artika, W., Ratih & Ningtias, 2021; Ummah et al., 2021).

The use of storyline-based learning media online makes learning materials innovative and creative. This can increase the knowledge of teachers and students in getting to know new media and technologies. Strengthening teacher teaching competencies in



creating storyline-based articulation learning media innovations in schools is not without obstacles, teachers and students will definitely be enthusiastic in participating in this learning.

## 4. Hand Puppet

To improve a child's speaking ability, an educator is expected to act as a facilitator in developing students' ability to learn to speak. Asking students to stand in front of the class and tell stories without any variation in learning is monotonous. This causes a lack of enthusiasm and interest in the learning process and this will only lead to saturation in the learning process. An effective and efficient learning process will have a great impact on students. One of the learning media that can be used is hand puppets. Hand puppets can be used as learning alternatives that can support the process of developing English speaking skills. According to Sudjana (2010: 188) hand puppets are dolls that can be moved by hand. This media is tantamount to inviting children to play, we know that playing is a spontaneous activity where a child will use other people or objects around him voluntarily and imaginatively using his feelings or all his body parts. Without realizing it, students will learn to use hand puppets to develop their speaking skills. This hand puppet media is quite popular among children.

When playing with dolls, children will be stimulated to practice and develop brain career skills and children's imagination is also very effective in helping children learn language. Based on research (Hadi et al, 2019) this hand puppet media plays an active role in improving students' abilities in speaking English skills. The results obtained can be seen from the activeness of students when the process of teaching and learning activities takes place. Therefore, this media can be proven to be successful in improving students' abilities in speaking English skills.

## **CONCLUSION**
